On-farm slaughter of poultry training course

The Humane Slaughter Association (HSA) is teaching a poultry welfare training course 'On-farm slaughter of poultry' at Plumpton College, East Sussex, on 19th November 2014.

The course will provide practical guidance on humane techniques for catching, restraint, stunning and killing of poultry on-farm. It is designed for persons who intend to slaughter birds on-farm for the table and/or who need to kill sick or injured birds. There will be a classroom session in which the principles of the techniques are discussed, followed by a demonstration of the relevant equipment using models of poultry.
