## TECHNICAL INFORMATION POSTERS ON HUMANE HANDLING OF LIVESTOCK TRANSLATED INTO CHINESE

In line with the HSA's objective of raising welfare standards for food animals worldwide, the charity's simple, but effective, posters on the humane handling and stunning of livestock have now been translated into Chinese.

For some months, the HSA has been having discussions with organisations in China to share knowledge, resources and HSA expertise on farm animal welfare and humane slaughter science and innovation with the Chinese livestock industry. The posters, which can be downloaded via the HSA's website (www.hsa.org.uk) are designed to give a quick reference in the workplace or during training to help ensure best practice. They join a suite of posters and other material which have already been translated and are available to download free of charge from the charity's website.

Charles Mason, Technical Director of the HSA said: "We are grateful to our members and donors whose support has enabled us to make these translations. We are delighted to be able to work with Chinese industry, to assist with promoting good practices for improving the welfare of farmed animals during transport, marketing and at slaughter."
